Executive Summary

Introduction

This volume (Volume 5) details the compilation of information and program materials and resources undertaken for the Parenting Information Project.

Compilation of information and program materials

To build an overview of the various types of information available and the format in which they are presented across Australia, a brief compilation of materials was undertaken. This comprised four components:

- ❑ collection of examples of information and program material throughout the consultation process;
- ❑ development and distribution of a survey to obtain information about the structure, evaluation evidence and future suggestions for improving programs currently operating across Australia;
- ❑ investigation of websites providing information pertinent to parenting; and
- ❑ investigation of videos providing information pertinent to parenting.

A summary of the process and key findings of these tasks is presented below.

Collected examples of information and program material

During the consultation phase, professionals were given the opportunity to provide relevant parenting program and support resource material. The purpose of gathering materials was to build an overview of the various types of information available and the format in which they are presented. Note that this compilation is **not comprehensive**. It is neither an audit of material nor a critique.

All material received was read or viewed and logged into the Excel database. The database consists of fifteen categories, which provide information about, but is not limited to, document title, type of material (report, information about a program, service, etc), the target audience, a brief description of the program/document and topics covered.

A total of 495 separate records of information pertaining to parenting was gathered and logged into the database. Investigation of the databases indicated that:

- ❑ The types of information gathered are varied and include reports, information about programs and services, newspapers, magazines, resources and facts sheets for parents.
- ❑ Information was provided from a range of organisations and funding providers, covering both federal and state government as well as independent organisations and institutions.
- ❑ The majority of material received was information that was provided to parents and carers/guardians and/or professionals. This included advice, clues, tips, research, and facts about specific parenting issues on a range of topics such as sleeping, behaviour, breastfeeding, eating, smacking or stages of child development.
- ❑ A considerable proportion of materials gathered were brochures advertising services and parenting programs associated with daycare, family services, interventions, home-visiting, clinics, parenting groups, playgroups, and training sessions.
- ❑ Sixty-three reports were provided to the Centre for Community Child Health. These include discussion papers, evaluations, annual reports, systematic reviews, action plans, literature reviews, strategic plans and policy information.

-
- ❑ A further 25 newspapers, newsletters, magazines or journals were provided, often presented as glossy magazines, which target parents and provide them with variety of information about parenting concerns, products, services, programs, current literature and research.
 - ❑ Other types of information included articles in journals and newspapers, catalogues of services and programs, conference information, resources, videos and web-sites.
 - ❑ Parenting information materials were provided in many formats, including A4 documents, brochures, posters, flyers, magnets, postcards, newsletters, electronic information, magazines, spiral bound booklets and a calendar.
 - ❑ A number of pamphlets, brochures and posters were also provided with examples in other languages.
 - ❑ More than 250 of the items logged provided a website link and more than 130 items provided additional referral pathways if required. Examples of pathways provided in the materials included a general practitioner, a maternal and child health nurse, reading lists, web-sites, translators, legal services, telephone help-lines, alcohol and drug programs and services, libraries, health centres, hospitals, ambulance providers and various specialised services and associations.

Survey of available programs

To illustrate further the range of parent education and support programs available across Australia, a brief survey was developed and distributed across a range of channels to seek information about the structure, evaluation evidence and future suggestions for improving programs currently operating across Australia.

An Excel database, similar to that developed for logging the collected parenting information material, was developed and survey feedback logged accordingly.

In total, 49 surveys were completed and returned in time for processing. Examination of these surveys provide some insight into the range of programs operating across parts of Australia to support parents. For example:

- ❑ There are programs operating to meet the needs of many different parent groups including:
 - new/first-time mothers
 - young mothers
 - expectant parents
 - expectant fathers
 - families with children from birth to age 12
 - families with children with a developmental delay or disability
 - families from CALD communities who require support or are interested in enhancing parenting skills
 - families in difficult circumstances (disadvantaged, at risk of domestic violence, family breakdown, etc).
- ❑ The documented programs vary in the aims they seek to achieve. The most common goals can be summarised as follows (not in order of priority):
 - to enhance parenting competence and confidence
 - to provide positive parenting skills
 - to improve knowledge about child growth and development
 - to improve pregnancy and post-natal outcomes for young women
 - to increase early intervention and prevention of developmental delay/disability

-
- to support and encourage positive communication between parents and children
 - to provide opportunity for support and social networks to develop
 - to improve interactions between fathers and their children.
- The parenting programs described generally consist of sessions of 1 to 2 hours in duration, offered each week over a period of 4 to 8 consecutive weeks. A facilitator or educator usually coordinates each session, with different topics covered across the sessions.
 - The content areas commonly addressed in the documented parenting programs include:
 - child development and growth (including motor skills, development of language, senses and learning capabilities)
 - child nutrition, safety and hygiene
 - sleeping, settling and feeding routines
 - immunisation
 - attachment, play and social interactions
 - positive relationships, communication and life skills
 - parenting skill development and managing difficult behaviours
 - balancing family and work pressures.
 - Recruitment to participate in the documented programs included self-referral and referral from a range of government and non-government services.
 - Most respondents indicated that some form of evaluation had been, or was being, conducted. Where further details were provided, the majority of these evaluations were based on self-completed pre and post program questionnaires or forms, seeking participants' satisfaction, enjoyment and, in some cases, changes in knowledge as a result of attending the program. From the limited information provided, respondents reported positive outcomes from these evaluations. For several programs, respondents indicated that formal outcome evaluations had been undertaken or were underway to determine program effectiveness in the longer term.
 - Some of the suggestions for improvements to programs in the future included the need for:
 - more resourcing to allow more sessions, over a longer time and more often
 - sessions to be available and accessible to wider groups and greater numbers of parents
 - more home visits, often as follow-up to formal sessions
 - sessions for parents to understand more about themselves and how the way in which they were parented influences their own parenting style.

Investigation of parenting websites

Examples of websites providing parenting information were sought as part of the project. A member of the project team searched the World Wide Web to identify websites providing information pertinent to parenting. All such websites identified were documented. In addition, websites that were provided as links were also explored and documented. For each website the following details were documented: website address, organisation/service name, details and contact details, where available.

In total 398 websites were investigated, including 170 Australian sites. These Australian sites were examined and 98 were categorised under the heading information providers, 28 under service providers, 26 under training providers and a further 18 under peak bodies. An additional 208 international sites were also documented.

Investigation of parenting videos

When searching the World Wide Web for pertinent parenting websites, a member of the project team also documented videos available to purchase or borrow, that contained information relevant to parenting. The video material was recorded and information was entered into an excel database. The following categories of information were recorded: website address, video topic, developer, state, target audience, ordering process and cost associated with purchasing the video.

The purpose of this investigation was to simply illustrate the range of video material available when searching the World Wide Web. The process does not make any reference to the quality, content or credibility of the videos listed.

The investigation found 86 Australian videos relating to parenting issues, with some available from organisations in most Australian states. Thirty-three are targeted at parents of children aged from birth to 5 years of age. In addition, 12 videos are targeted at parents of children with down syndrome, 15 at parents of preschool aged children and 5 at parents of newborn babies. Videos specifically related to the needs of fathers, Indigenous children, children with young parents and children with a disability were also identified.

These videos cover a range of topics including, but not limited to, child development, behaviour, communication and language development, developmental delay, preparation for the various stages of child development, development of reading, mothering, fathering, children's and babies' needs, play, discipline, sleeping, settling, nutrition, self esteem and sibling relationships. Finally, around 80 further videos associated with international websites were also documented. Analysis of the target audiences and topics covered by these videos has not been undertaken.

Summary

The brief compilation of examples, information and supports carried out for this project has shown that there is a plethora of parenting information available across Australia and overseas, covering a wide range of parenting topics and needs. The materials gathered are not comprehensive; rather, the purpose was to build an overview of the various types of information available and the format in which they are presented. Further investigation is warranted to determine the quality, credibility and usage of the information, programs, websites and videos identified.

1 Introduction

1.1 Background to project

This volume (Volume 5 of the Parenting Information Project report) details the compilation of collected materials undertaken in the second stage of the Parenting Information Project. The findings of stage one and other components of stage two are documented in separate reports.

2 Compilation of information and program materials

2.1 Collected examples of information and program material

2.1.1 Collection and documentation process

During the consultation phase, professionals were given the opportunity to provide relevant parenting program and support resource material. The material gathered for the purpose of this project *is not comprehensive*. The purpose in gathering materials was to build an overview of the various types of information available and the format in which they are presented.

An Excel database was developed to categorise material into a useful format. The database consists of fifteen categories, defined for the purpose of this compilation as follows:

<i>Document title</i>	The title of material provided. If the material was unusual, for example a poster or magnet, then the bold heading was recorded as the title.
<i>Funding body</i>	The organisation or body that funded the material, program or service.
<i>Organisation provider</i>	The provider of the service, program or information.
<i>Format</i>	How the material was provided; for example, poster, video, pamphlet. Where relevant, the size and or number of pages was also recorded.
<i>Type</i>	A classification of the type of material supplied; for example, a report, information about a program or service, information about parenting skills or techniques, etc.
<i>Target</i>	Who the material was developed for.
<i>Brief description</i>	A brief description of the content of the material provided.
<i>Conclusions of key findings</i>	A brief overview of key findings or conclusions of reports where provided.
<i>Published by</i>	Publisher of the information.
<i>Edited or author</i>	The author and/or editor of the material.
<i>Date published</i>	Date of publication.
<i>Website</i>	Provision of a website related to the material and provided on the material.
<i>Slogan</i>	Word or phrase adopted as a motto for the material, service or organisation.
<i>Topics covered</i>	Overview of the topics covered in the material, generally taken from topic headings or chapter headings.
<i>Further pathways provided</i>	Information about any further pathways for additional information, services or programs, supplied in the material.

All material received by the Centre for Community Child Health was read or viewed by a member of the project team then logged into the Excel database (see **Appendix A**). All relevant

categories were completed for each piece of information; where categories were left blank, information was either not relevant or unknown.

All information within the database was extracted to illustrate the types of information available and the format in which they are presented. As noted above, the database is *not* an audit of material, nor is it a critique.

2.1.2 Examination of collected examples

2.1.2.1 Type of information documented

As shown in the following table, 495 separate records of information pertaining to parenting were gathered and logged into the database. The types of information are varied and include reports, information about programs and services, newspapers, magazines, resources and fact sheets for parents. Information was provided from a range of organisations and funding providers, including both federal and state governments as well as independent organisations and institutions.

The majority of material received was information provided either to parents and carers/guardians and/or to professionals. Material was defined as *information for parents/carers and/or professionals* if it was stand-alone information on one or more parenting topics, skills or techniques; for example, information, advice, clues, tips, research and facts about specific parenting issues on a range of topics such as sleeping, behaviour, breastfeeding, eating, smacking or stages of child development.

A considerable proportion of the materials gathered were brochures advertising services and parenting programs. Over 100 brochures were received and included services and programs for

daycare, family services, interventions, home-visiting, clinics, parenting groups, playgroups, and training sessions.

Sixty-three reports were provided to the Centre for Community Child Health. These include discussion papers, evaluations, annual reports, systematic reviews, action plans, literature reviews, strategic plans and policy information.

A further 25 newspapers, newsletters, magazines or journals were provided. Many are presented as glossy magazines that target parents and provide them with variety of information about parenting concerns, products, services, programs, current literature and research.

Other types of information provided include articles in journals and newspapers, catalogues of services and programs, conference information, resources, videos and web-sites.

2.1.2.2 Format

Parenting information materials were provided in many formats, including A4 documents, brochures, posters, flyers, magnets, postcards, newsletters, electronic information, magazines, spiral bound booklets and a calendar. Materials ranged in age from 1984 to current at time of provision (of those materials where the date was known). A number of pamphlets, brochures and posters were provided with examples in other languages.

2.1.2.3 Additional pathways/information points

Of the 495 items of parenting information provided, more than 250 provided a website link and more than 130 items provided additional referral pathways if required. Examples of pathways provided in the material were “your general practitioner”, “your maternal and child health nurse”, reading lists, web-sites, translators, legal services, telephone help-lines, alcohol and drug programs and services, libraries, health centres, hospitals, ambulance providers and various specialised services and associations.

2.2 Survey of available programs

2.2.1 Collection process

To provide further information on the range of parent education and support programs available across Australia, a brief survey was developed and distributed via a number of web-based *listservers* believed to be accessed by many early childhood professionals. The survey was also forwarded to all those who contacted the project team demonstrating their interest to be involved in the project and to many of those who attended focus group discussions.

The survey asked professionals a range of questions about the program operated or managed by their organisation. The questions sought information about the program, its structure, evidence from any evaluations carried out, and suggestions for improving the programs in the future.

An Excel database, similar to that developed for logging the collected parenting information material, was developed. Survey feedback was logged into this database, using the following 19 categories:

<i>Respondent</i>	Name of survey respondent.
<i>Organisation</i>	The provider of the service, program or information.
<i>Position in organisation</i>	Survey respondent's position in the organisation.
<i>Title of program</i>	The title of the program.
<i>Funding body</i>	The organisation or body that funded the program or service.
<i>Overall program aim</i>	The overall aim of the program.
<i>Intended target group</i>	The intended target group of the program.

<i>Program delivery approach</i>	Delivery approach (eg. home visit, parents' session, support group, etc).
<i>Location</i>	Location in which the program is offered.
<i>Session number and frequency</i>	Number of sessions, frequency and duration of sessions.
<i>Client recruitment</i>	Approach to recruit clients, including referrals.
<i>Program content</i>	Content covered during the program.
<i>Selection of material</i>	Bases on which material is selected for inclusion in the program.
<i>Reference material</i>	Reference material used to development content/materials.
<i>Top 3 websites</i>	Websites believed to be most useful to this program.
<i>Evaluation evidence</i>	Details of any evaluations undertaken to determine program effectiveness.
<i>Evaluation design</i>	Details of evaluation design or approach.
<i>Evaluation outcomes</i>	Details of key outcomes from evaluation evidence.
<i>Future Improvements</i>	Suggestions for future improvements to the program.

In total, 49 surveys were completed and returned in time for processing. See **Appendix B** for detailed survey results.

2.2.2 Examination of documented programs

The 49 survey responses provide some insight into the range of programs operating across parts of Australia to support parents. Though an audit of the programs documented has not been conducted in this project, some description of the documented programs is warranted.

- The are programs operating to meet the needs of many different parent groups including:
 - new/first times mothers
 - young mothers
 - expectant parents.
 - expectant fathers
 - families with children from birth to age 12
 - families with children with a developmental delay or disability
 - families from CALD communities who require support or are interested in enhancing parenting skills
 - families in difficult circumstances (disadvantaged, at risk of domestic violence, family breakdown, etc).
- The documented programs vary in the aims they seek to achieve. The most common goals can be summarised as follows (not in order of priority):

 - child nutrition, safety and hygiene
 - sleeping, settling and feeding routines
 - immunisation
 - attachment, play and social interactions
 - positive relationships, communication and life skills
 - parenting skill development and managing difficult behaviours
 - balancing family and work pressures.
 - ❑ Recruitment to participate in the documented programs included both self-referral and referral from a range of government and non-government services. Many respondents reported that some form of promotional material (such as leaflets, magazine articles, or newsletters) were used to encourage attendance by parents in the wider community.
 - ❑ The survey asked respondents to comment on the extent of evaluation conducted for each program. Responses indicated that some form of evaluation had been, or was being, conducted. Where further details were provided, the majority of these evaluations were based on self-completed pre and post program questionnaires or forms, seeking participants' satisfaction, enjoyment and, in some cases, changes in knowledge as a result of attending the program. From the limited information provided, respondents report positive outcomes from these evaluations. For several programs, respondents indicated that formal outcome evaluations had been or were being undertaken to determine program effectiveness in the longer term.
 - ❑ Some of the suggestions for improvements to programs in the future included the need for:
 - more resourcing to allow more sessions, over a longer time, and more often
 - sessions to be available and accessible to wider groups and greater numbers of parents
 - more home visits, often as follow-up to attending formal sessions
 - sessions for parents to understand more about themselves and how the way in which they were parented influences their parenting style.

2.3 Investigation of parenting websites

2.3.1 Investigation process

To identify examples of websites providing parenting information, a member of the project team searched the World Wide Web through the 'Google' and 'Ask Jeeves' search engines, using the search terms 'parenting' and 'early childhood' to identify websites providing information pertinent to parenting.

All websites identified that contained information pertinent to parenting were documented. In addition, websites that were provided as links were also explored and documented. For each website the following details were documented: website address, organisation/service name, details and contact details where available. All websites were then categorised as Australian or

International sites, and as government or non-government. The Australian-based sites were further split into the categories of information providers, services providers, training providers and peak bodies (though there is some duplication of sites between these categories).

A list of the websites documented in this investigation is provided in **Appendix C**.

2.3.2 Types of websites found

In total 398 websites were investigated, and a total of 170 Australian sites were examined. Ninety-eight of these sites were categorised under the heading information providers, 28 under service providers, 26 under training providers, and 18 under peak bodies. The additional 208 International sites were also visited and documented.

2.4 Investigation of parenting videos

2.4.1 Investigation process

A search for parenting videos available to purchase or borrow on the World Wide Web was also undertaken. When searching for pertinent parenting websites, a member of the project team also documented videos that contained information relevant to parenting. The relevant video material was recorded and information was entered into an Excel database. The following categories of information were recorded: website address, video topic, developer, state, target audience, ordering process and cost associated with purchasing the video.

The purpose of this investigation was to simply illustrate the range of video material available when searching the World Wide Web. No reference has been made to the quality, content or credibility of the videos listed.

A list of the videos documented is provided in **Appendix D**.

2.4.2 Types of videos available

The investigation found 86 Australian videos relating to parenting issues, with videos available from organisations in most Australian states.

Investigation of these videos found 33 to be targeted to parents of children aged from birth to 5 years of age. A further 12 were targeted to parents of children with down syndrome, 15 for parents of preschool-aged children, and 5 for parents of newborn babies. Videos specifically related to the needs of fathers, Indigenous children, children with young parents and children with a disability were also identified.

The videos cover a range of topics including, but not limited to, child development, behaviour, communication and language development, developmental delay, preparation for the various stages of child development, development of reading, mothering, fathering, children's and babies' needs, play, discipline, sleeping, settling, nutrition, self esteem and sibling relationships.

Around 80 further videos associated with international websites were also documented. Analysis of the target audiences and topics covered by these videos has not been undertaken within this project.

3 Summary

This volume (Volume 5) has detailed and documented the findings of the compilation of collected program materials and resources.

Overall, the brief compilation of examples of information and supports illustrates that there is a plethora of parenting information available across Australia and overseas, covering a wide range of parenting topics and needs. The material gathered for the compilation is not comprehensive; the purpose, rather, was to build an overview of the various types of information available and the format in which they are presented. Further investigation is warranted to determine the quality, credibility and usage of the information, programs, websites and videos identified.
